DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY:

401 Paseo del Pueblo Norte is a single story Spanish Pueblo Revival style stuccoed commercial structure with a flat parapet that undulates slightly to the north concealing a shed roofline. Windows are a mix of wooden nine-lite casement units, and plate glass with sidelights and snap in muntin grilles. A small projecting shed-roofed portal with carved posts and corbels is centrally-located on the west elevation. Entrance to the structure is through a single-leaf multi-lite wood panel door under the portal. A secondary entrance is at the south west corner through a diagonal plank wooden single leaf unit. The addition on the south is also detailed with exposed viga end and canales on the south elevation. There is a low stucco yard wall which undulates in height across the front of the building at the sidewalk. Parking is to the south of the building at the corner of Brooks Street.

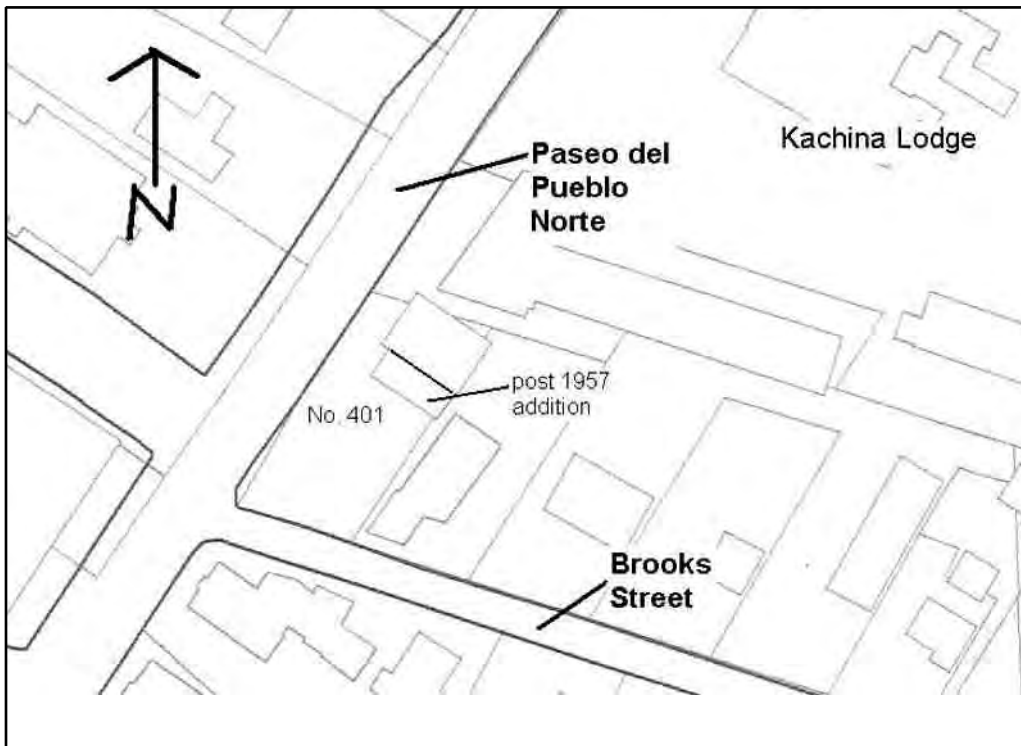
